Amachi's program supports one-on-one mentoring. It empowers and supports youth by matching them with caring adult role models to help break the generational cycle of incarceration. Mentors and mentees are expected to meet at least twice a month (for a minimum of 4 hours/month). The monthly activities are based on common interests and the desire for new experiences.

Amachi Ambassadors develop youth leadership to empower constituents to raise awareness and become agents of change through the use of their powerful voices and compelling stories. Youth are trained to produce educational materials, facilitate workshops, and build a youth organizing movement.

Andy Warhol Museum

Youth Open Studio: A collaboration between The Andy Warhol Museum and Artists Image Resource (AIR), an artist-run printmaking facility on Pittsburgh’s North Side. Teens learn the photographic silkscreen printing process, experiment with new art-making tools and techniques, and work on independent projects in a relaxed, creative environment. The studio at AIR is open from 4–8 p.m. each Wednesday for youth ages 13–18, and it is staffed by The Warhol’s artist educators. There is no fee to visit, watch, or learn, but youth pay between \$5–10 for each silkscreen needed for independent projects. Youth Open Studio is supported in part by The Buhl Foundation.

Youth Arts Council: a yearlong leadership program that invites a small team of high school students from across Pittsburgh to go behind the scenes, collaborate with museum staff and artists, create art, and develop public programs and events for other teens. Youth Arts Council participants receive stipends, gain professional experience working in a museum, and learn new skills and techniques. Applications are accepted in the Fall.

LGBTQ+ Youth Prom: The Warhol hosts an annual LGBTQ+ Youth Prom, one of the only LGBTQ+ youth proms in Southwestern Pennsylvania. Prom is often considered a “rite of passage” and creates memories that last a lifetime. The Warhol’s Youth Prom offers a safe, gender-inclusive space where LGBTQ+ young people can celebrate with dinner, dancing, and art making. Prom is open to young people ages 13–20, and it is planned by a youth committee.

Youth Invasion: Teens take over The Warhol! Planned by and for teens, Youth Invasion is an annual spring celebration that invites young artists, performers, and designers to transform the entire museum with their creative energy. Get involved with planning Youth Invasion as part of the Youth Arts Council, or apply to perform and showcase your talents.

After-school Silkscreen Printmaking Program at Perry Traditional Academy: Artist Educators from The Warhol lead hands-on art making activities at Perry on Monday afternoons.

Be a Middle School Mentor (BAMSM) is the largest school-based mentoring program in our region's history. We match hundreds of successful adult mentors with middle school students to learn about real careers and jobs, to develop big dreams for their future, to understand the importance of doing well in school, and to have another caring adult role model.

More than 2,100 students in the Pittsburgh and Southwestern Pennsylvania area have been matched with a mentor since 2009, making it a highly significant and impactful mentoring initiative, with plans to continue its expansion and positive outcomes for at risk children. 85% of mentees have at least a 90% school attendance rate.

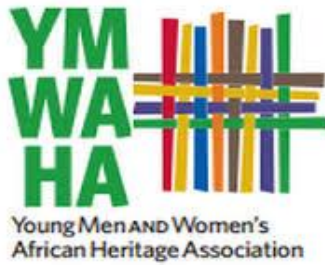
